



The James L. Flood, mansion at 2120 Broadway, built in 1902, has long housed the Sara Dix Hamlin School for girls. Flood's father built his brownstone mansion on Nob Hill, now the Pacific Union Club. The younger Flood obviously admired his father's famous bronze fence; he installed a slightly more modest version of it around this house, with splendid entrance gates (left). James Jr.'s widow, Maude Flood, liked to say it was unusual for a woman to have a daughter born in a men's club and a son born in a girls' school. An interior detail (near left) shows the excellent craftsmanship of the house in an intricate mosaic wall with a fine bronze sconce.
